

Minutes of the Annual Meeting January 23, 2022

The Annual Parish Meeting of the Episcopal Church of St. John the Baptist was held on January 23, 2022 in accordance with Article 3 of the By-laws of the Episcopal Church of St. John the Baptist and amended January 22, 2006.

The Annual meeting was in the church and on Zoom following the 9am Sunday Service.

Father Dave opened the 2022 Annual meeting with prayer.

A quorum of 23 baptized members of the church participated. Dave Moberg made a motion to nominate Ann Elkins as recording clerk. Dave G. seconded. All agreed.

Dave Moberg made a motion to have Ann record the minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting. Dave Giunta seconded.

Dave Tyler made a motion to accept the minutes of the 2021 meeting minutes. Dave Giunta seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Dave Moberg made a motion to dispense with the reading the committee reports. All agreed.

Father Dave thanked everyone for coming and said farewell to those going off the vestry, Maureen Gillum, Mary Cullinan. Welcomed new vestry members, Julia Stackpole and Anne Prunier. New convocation member is Julia Stackpole and Dave Tyler and Dave Giunta are alternates.

The year 2022 saw us going between being on or wearing masks in church. Communion was different as no wine could be served, only bread. During outdoor Services, you brought your own and served yourself communion. These were some of the issues we faced. Life in the parish resumed with COVID protocols in place.

The Bishop is scheduled to visit on September 11 and dedicate the new Hansen-Pike Hall.

Treasurer's report was approved for the new year.

Priest's Report

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

I am blessed to have served as a part-time Transition Pastor at St. John the Baptist Church since early June, 2022. In conversation with the Bishop, members of the Vestry and Wardens of the parish, I was asked to work with the congregation during its time between the retirement of the Rev. Dave DeSalvo and the call of a new priest for the parish. Supporting the parish as it lives into its ministry with a part-time priest is an important aspect of our work together. We have been looking at many facets of the life of the congregation, including worship, administration, education, pastoral care, outreach, and community building.

Worship has been a particular focus of our efforts. With the expectation that the half-time priest in charge of the parish will take responsibility for leading the service on two Sundays a month, a rotation of supply clergy and parishioners leading Morning Prayer will cover the other regular Sundays. Holy days and special events are handled outside the usual pattern for worship leadership.

Regular adult education is also a challenge for the parish. Leading weekly Bible Study alternated between clergy and members of the congregation. Coordinating this has been difficult and the group decided to suspend meeting for the winter. In order to offer educational opportunities to the larger parish, the Parish Hall now has a large 'smart' TV. Classes can be led by clergy or members of the congregation in combination with presentations from the internet.

During this 'in between time,' the parish is working with the Diocesan staff to call a new Rector. In July and August, 2022, the congregation gathered after Sunday worship to explore the four questions for the transition process:

- 1. What is our purpose/mission?
- 2. What are our core strengths?
- 3. What are our present challenges?
- 4. What is our liturgical style?

Responses to the questions have been provided to those who are interested in the position and have also sparked conversations among parishioners about the congregation's identity and life.

The congregation of St. John the Baptist Church is not large but it is faithful and has a vibrant life. It is my prayer that the search process brings a priest to serve this community who can help it to continue its growth in service and ministry.

StJB EpiscoGolf 2022 Benefitting Children's Charities: v 2 12-18-22

In review, St John's EpiscoGolf 2022 raffle brought in a total of \$11,844; and had \$13,079.24 in our EpiscoGolf account (11/22). We had ten 2022 EpiscoGolf grant application requests this fall totaling \$10,000, which I sent out 11/22/22 (grant notification letters, w/ StJB EpiscoGolf checks, by USPS, see below). ADDITIONALLY on 12-18-22, we gave a late \$500 grant to Families in Transition (Rochester, NH, a late app) and \$250 to a E. Wakefield family (Bucknan-Robinson Fund) w/ a 13 yr old who lost everything in a home fire 12/16/22. This will leave us a balance of \$2,329.24 to start next year's E-Golf efforts (should leave min. of ~\$1,500; seed money restart golf tournament per Pruniers?) and/or to disperse to help kids (StJB Cares requests?).
